The Fair Budget Coalition advocates for budget and public policy initiatives that address poverty and human needs in the District of Columbia.

## **Rules for Testifying**

You have 3 minutes for your testimony, so prepare a 3 minute version of your testimony to give in person.



Your written testimony can be longer and you can always let the council know that they can look at it for more details.



Be brief and clear.



Highlight the most important issues to you.



Stay on your message.



If you are identifying a problem, try to have a solution.

## How to Write a Successful Testimony



Identify who you are:

- o Name
- o Why your testimony is significant: ex. My name is Kenneth Matthews and I am currently living in a homeless shelter.
- o What you are testifying about: ex. I am here to testify about how the lack of job programs has hurt my chances of leaving the shelter system.



Tell your story:

- o Pick an event or issue on which you have worked directly or by which you have been directly affected.
- o Tell what services (or lack of services) caused this event or issue.



Explain why you feel the need to testify:

- o How can what you are testifying about benefit or damage the event or issue you just spoke about?
- Why will this outcome be helpful or harmful?



Share your recommendations:

- O What solutions do you see?
- How can the problems you brought up be solved?
- What do you think will be helpful in dealing with the issue or event you talked about?



Thank the council members for the opportunity to speak:

- o Ask that your solutions be taken into consideration.
- Thank everyone for listening or reading information.
